

Avoiding conflict with police at a rally, gathering or public event

1. Unalienable (absolute) right to remain silent: **Rice v Connolly**.
2. Remain calm, peaceful, and respectful. Stay silent and turn your back wherever possible.
3. Avoid complying with requests or answering questions. This is interpreted as permission/consent.
4. If asked a question, you may ask: **“Are we obliged to answer that question?”**
5. Ask: **“Can we see your warrant card* and have your badge number”** (*unless at a public rally).
6. Ask: **“Are you here under an oath or affirmation to serve We the People? If so, we have not summoned you and you are dismissed!”**
7. Otherwise say: **“We do not consent. We do not wish to contract”**.
8. If a threat of arrest arises or persists, quote **Police & Criminal Evidence Act 1984** – an arrest must pass the necessity test under **Code G** or be unlawful. Officer risks their job. Now recite:

Personal Accountability Notice

“You, <officer’s name and number>, are clearly operating unlawfully without oath/affirmation of public office. You are therefore a privately contracted agent and not protected by public indemnity insurance. We therefore hold you privately accountable and personally liable for any harm or loss caused to us by your unlawful conduct.”

Fee Schedule Notice – False Imprisonment

“You, <officer’s name and number>, are also put on notice that we shall charge false imprisonment at £3,000 per hour or part thereof or £1,000 per minute if considered a vulnerable person.”

If arrested:

1. No obligation to cooperate or give name / address (see below (#9.) for crimes committed by officer)
2. Any cooperation should be made **“under duress”** and **“reserving all unalienable rights”**
3. No rights to take fingerprints unless offence is imprisonable

Criminal offences & common law crimes committed by officers:

1. Threaten to arrest and/or break and enter = **Assault**
2. Seize wo/man against their will = **Battery**
3. Take into custody = **Abduction**
4. Saying: **“it’s the law!”** = **Fraud by misrepresentation**
5. Detain in custody = **False imprisonment**
6. Serving penalty charge notice (PCN) = **Aiding and abetting fraud by abuse of position**
7. Break in without warrant = **Criminal damage**
8. **Police Officer aids and abets a compliance agent** = Abuse of position - **section 26 Criminal Justice & Courts Act 2015** (Up to 14 years imprisonment for officer)
9. Asking wo/man for name and address = **Personage, Entrapment, Unlawful Conversion**
